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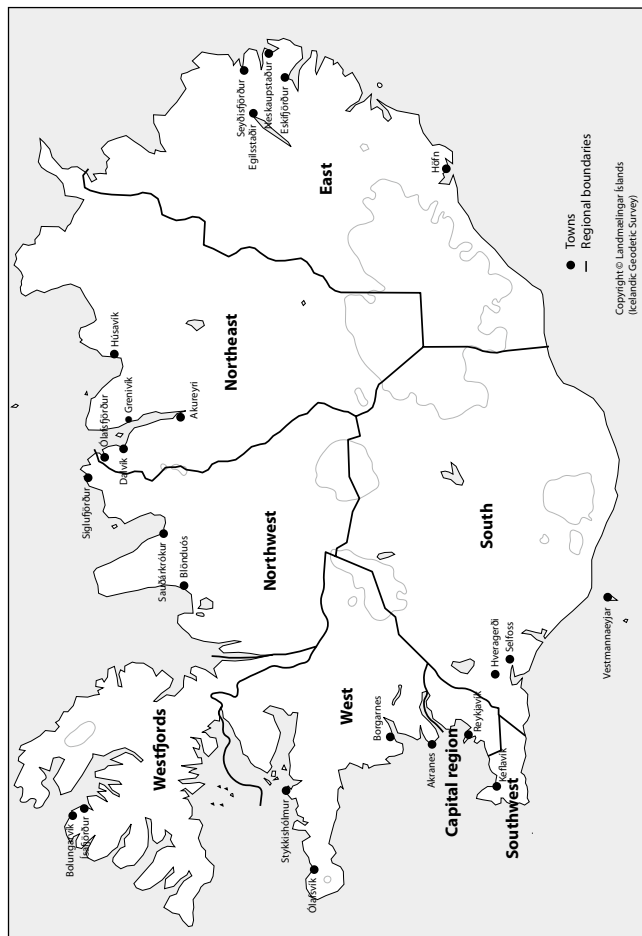

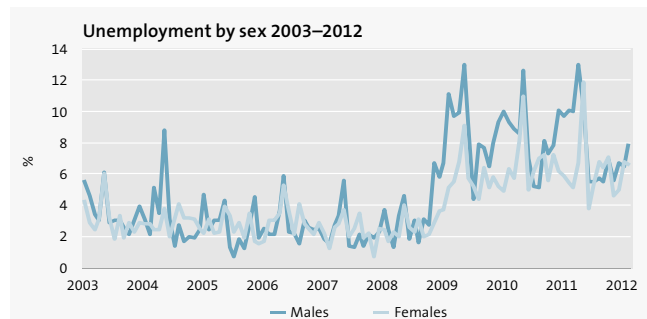
Total fertility rate 2010

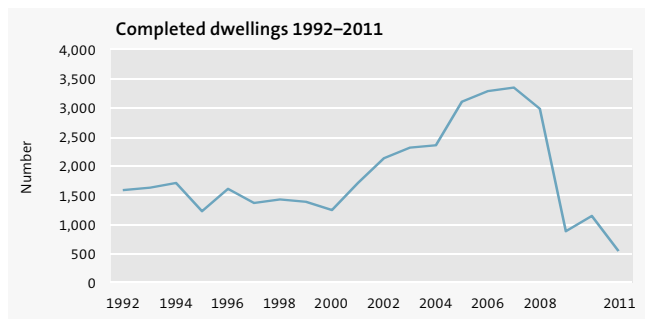

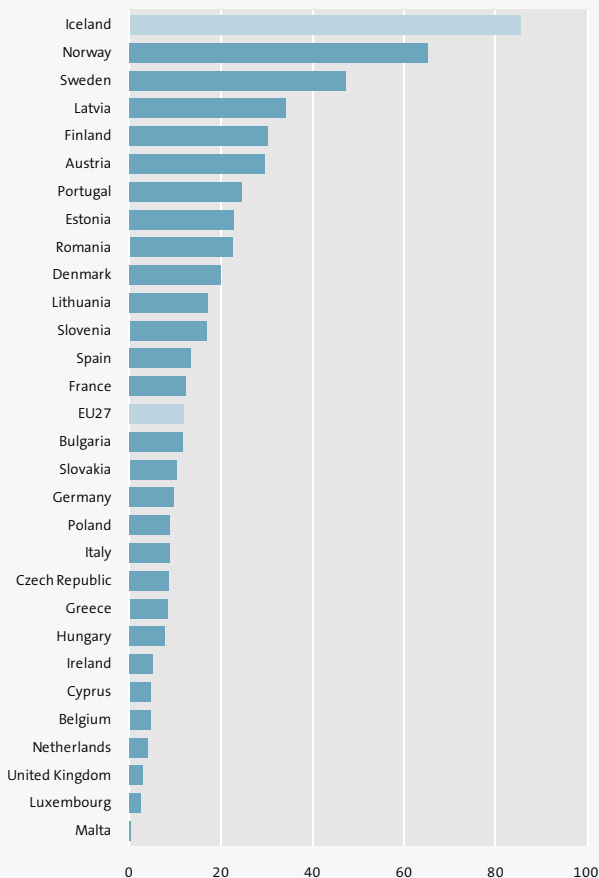

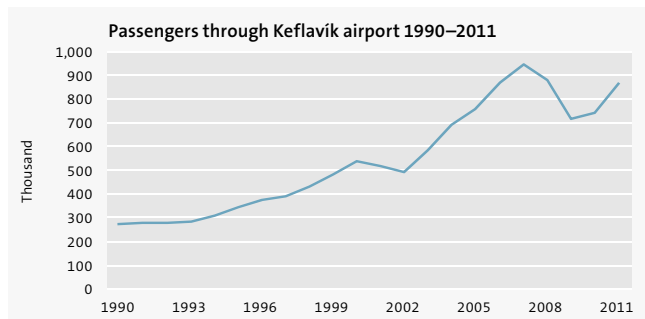
Renewable energy in gross final energy consumption 2009, %

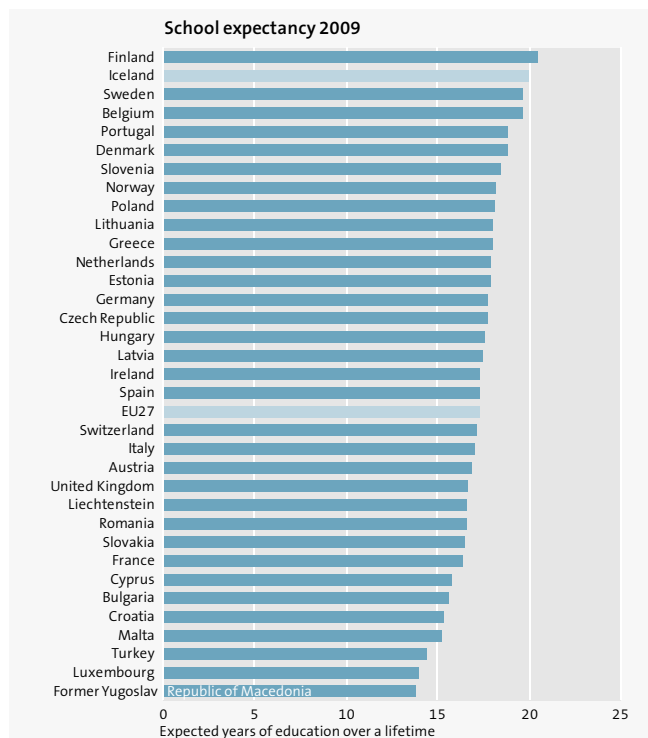
