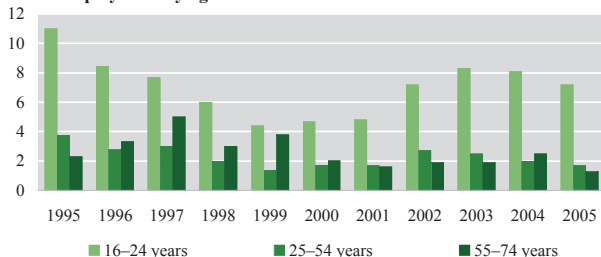

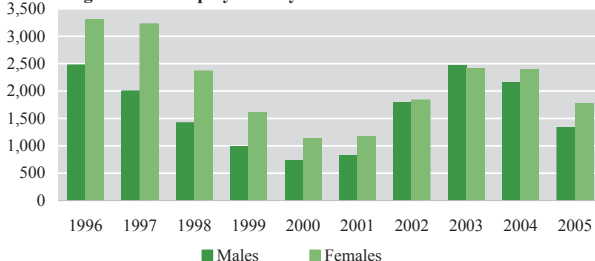

Registered unemployment by sex 1996–2005



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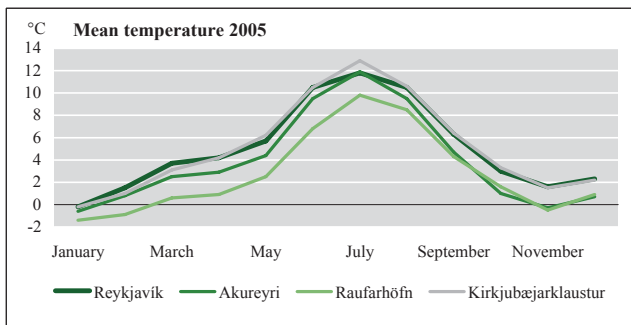
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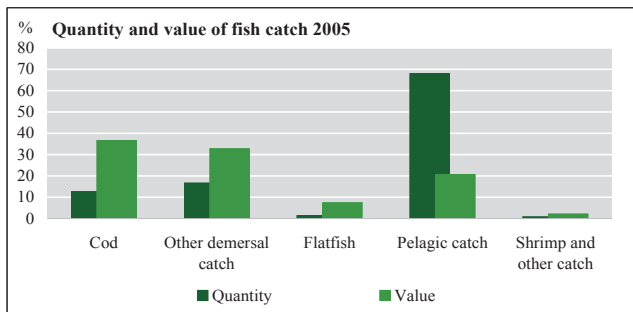

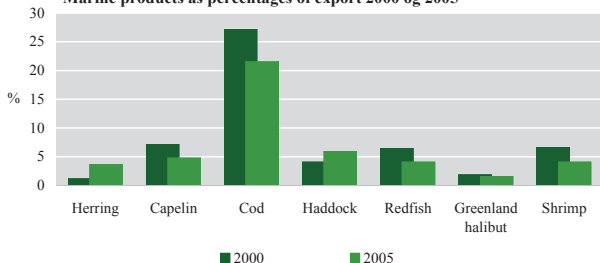

Marine products as percentages of export 2000 og 2005

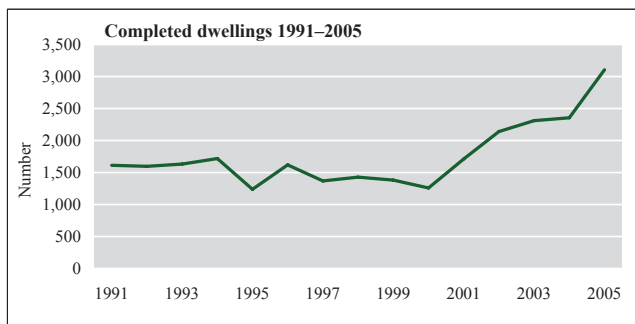
